Dr. Nahoko UCHIYAMA received her Ph.D. in Pharmaceutical Sciences from Kyoto University, Japan in 2004. After completing her Ph.D., she was a Junior Assistant Professor at the Department of Pharmacognosy, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Doshisha Women's College of Liberal Arts in Kyoto (Japan). From 2006, she was a Researcher and Senior Researcher at the Narcotics Section of the Pharmacognosy, Phytochemistry and Narcotics Division in National Institute of Health Sciences (NIHS) in Japan, and in 2016 became the Section Chief at the Pharmacognosy Section of the same Division of NIHS. Her expertise includes regulatory science of pharmaceuticals including natural medicines, illegal drugs, borderline products between foods and drugs, and natural product chemistry. She is also contributing to the development of Japanese Pharmacopoeia (JP) standards for crude drugs and Kampo extracts as a member of JP expert committee on crude drugs.
